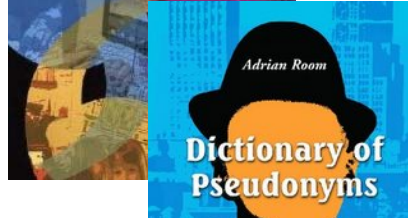
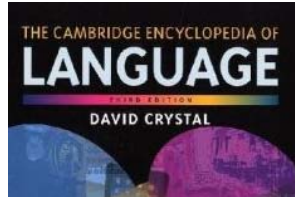

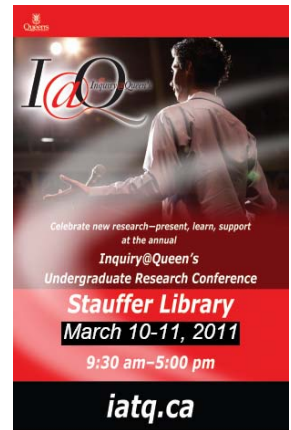
## CALL FOR PRESENTERS...

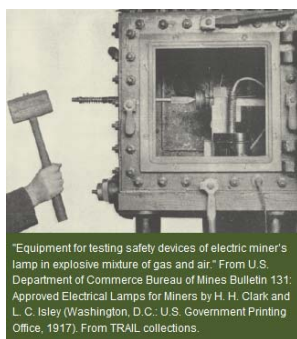

## NEW DATABASES

### Westlaw Canada LawSource

Provides coverage of unreported court decisions from 1986 forward, reported court decisions from 1977, and decisions published in Carswell law reports from their inception. Includes a collection of decisions predating 1977 from key courts and law report series.

### JustCite

Legal database; cross-references cases, legislation and journal articles and shows how they are related. Covers all major case law series from the UK and Ireland, as well as EU law and an increasing number of titles from common law jurisdictions around the world.

### CURRENT DATABASE TRIALS

#### APA Books e-Collection on the PsycNET Platform

Over 5,500 chapters from hundreds of books; full-text PDFs of APA-published scholarly and professional books. Explore until February 4, 2011.

#### Passport GMID (Global market Information Database)

From Euromonitor International; global in scope; provides business-related statistics, market research reports, and more. Explore until January 28, 2011.
