


Education Full Text (1983-); has audio feature! 534 journals and yearbooks and books (after 1994). Full text for 251 journals and yearbooks after 1996.

ERIC - Education Resources Information Center (1966-); Largest education database in the world. Sponsored by the U.S. Department of Education. Two separate indexes: Current Index to Journals in Education (CIJE) and Resources in Education (RIE). CIJE has 900 journals. RIE indexes unpublished resources such as conference papers and exemplary curriculum resources. The ERIC thesaurus is the best place to find lists of broader and narrower terms that can be applied in any database.

On the library homepage: Articles >> By Subject >> Education.

A good starting point is Education Research Complete and then try ERIC (Education Resources Information Centre) the world's largest education database.
